Putting Carers First

COVID-19 changed our lives overnight and the impact on carers and those they care for has been significant with many support services stopped or reduced. Additional caring responsibilities and a sense of isolation grew for many, affecting physical and mental well being. The fear of infection prevented many from asking for the help they may be entitled to.

At VOCAL, our commitment to putting carers first has grown even stronger as a result of this pandemic. Since April we have reshaped our support to carers. In May, we resumed training and group work programmes, provided by video conferences and webinars. Since August, in line with the government's road map, staff have returned to our buildings for at least one day a week.

Until the end of this year, perhaps longer, our premises can only be open by appointment, not for drop-ins or casual visits. Inside these pages you will see the precautions and protection we have put in place to make VOCAL safe for carers, staff and volunteers. Our centres may be closed to the general public, but VOCAL is open to carers!

So **please do contact us**, by email or phone, and **do refer carers** for help and support.

It's certainly not business as usual, but our staff and volunteers work as hard as ever to help wherever we can!

Since Treasure Tree began trading, many success stories have contributed to our passing over $\pm 20,000$ in profits directly back to carers. One our best ever successes happened during lockdown.

This April he got back in touch and asked us to sell the piece: a fourteen carat ballet bracelet weighing 81.72 grams, and valued at around \pm 1,300 for its bullion or scrap price.

The bracelet sold within twenty four hours for £1,890, to a buyer who bought the bracelet to wear and enjoy.

Our client was thrilled. As a silver donor half the value of his sale was donated to Treasure Tree, with the other half transferred directly to his bank account.
